What Genocide Is

Jewish Massacre

It happened on 1941 until 1945. At that time, there were nearly 9 million Jews in Europe, of whom nearly 2/3 were killed.

How did it occur

Germany implemented the persecution in stages. Following Adolf Hitler's rise to power in 1933, the government passed laws to exclude Jews from civil society, most prominently the Nuremberg Laws in 1935. The deportation of Jews to the ghettos culminated in the policy of extermination the Nazis called the "Final Solution to the Jewish Question", discussed by senior Nazi officials at the Wannsee Conference in Berlin in January 1942. As German forces captured territories in the East, all anti-Jewish measures were radicalized. Under the coordination of the SS, with directions from the highest leadership of the Nazi Party, killings were committed within Germany itself, throughout German-occupied Europe, and across all territories controlled by the Axis powers.

Why did it occur

The origin and first expression of Hitler's antisemitism remain a matter of debate. Central to his world view was the idea of expansion and lebensraum (living space) for Germany. Open about his hatred of Jews, he subscribed to the common antisemitic stereotypes. From the early 1920s onwards, he linked the Jews with germs and said they should be dealt with in the same way. He viewed Marxism as a Jewish doctrine, said he was fighting against "Jewish Marxism", and believed that Jews had created communism as part of a conspiracy to destroy Germany.

What was the world's response

In 1979, the federal court of West Germany made a strict definition of "freedom of speech" for the first time, and Jewish citizens had the right to ask the Nazis to recognize the persecution of Jews. In 1985, the Federal Parliament passed a resolution to deny that persecution of Jews should be punished by law.
