

# Antagonist

# Symbolism

"But now, she turns to the woman and adds, 'May I keep your scarf? The bleeding might start again. The woman looks for a moment as if she does not understand; then she nods."




## Irony

# Point of View

Although the novel is told in the third person, the author occasionally uses flash-forwards to provide information about the future and predict what will happen later.

"Later, the family will offer masses over and over for Nnedi to be found safe, though never for the repose of Nnedi's soul."

## Conflict

Person vs. society is the story's central conflict. The story's fundamental conflict is the contrast between two ethnicities and cultures, which leads toward rioting. And the two major characters are in the middle of it all.

## Literary Criticisms Lens

Biographical criticism is the criticism lens that I would apply to A Private Experience. Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie, the story's author, was born and reared in Nigeria. Nigeria is a deadly country, and it's likely that Chimamanda is speaking from personal experience.

"The woman climbs back into the store. 'Danger is finished. It is Abu. He is selling provisions. He is going to see his store. Everywhere policeman with tear gas. Soldier-man is coming. I go now before soldier man will begin to harass somebody. Chika stands slowly and stretches; her joints ache."
