What can you expect to see on this trip?

The South of France (including Nîmes, Arles, Avignon, Saint-Guilhem-le-Désert)

Based out of Nîmes, we will find ourselves in a region that was heavily influenced by the Roman Empire. As a result, we will have the opportunity to visit monuments that have been built close to 2000 years ago. We will also have the opportunity to explore cities and villages including one of "France's Most Beautiful Villages", Saint-Guilhem-le-Désert.

Saint Malo

This famous port city saw Jacques Cartier embark on a journey that would eventually lead to the discovery of the Saint Lawrence River and the founding of Quebec City in 1608.

Normandy (including Caen, Bayeux, Courseulles-sur-Mer)

Our primary focus in Normandy is understanding the causes and consequences of the Second World War. We will learn about how the Second World War came to be in our visits to the Mémorial de Caen, and the Centre Plage Juno. We will also pay our respects to the fallen in our visits to Canadian, American, and German war cemeteries as part of our journey.

Paris

While we only spend a few days in the City of Lights, our days are filled with visits and exploration of the city. Our visits include the Musée d'Orsay, the Catacombes, the Palais Garnier, and the Eiffel Tower of course!
