- 5. What do the students not seem to like River Hibbert?
- 6. What is the inciting incident in the story?
- 7. Using the information from the story, which perspective is the story told and who is the narrator?
- 8. How did the boys' plan of picking on and bullying the girls actually benefit the girls?
- 9. What is important about the line, "Nothing in our experience had led us to believe the grown-ups had the slightest inkling or interest in what really went on with kids"? (pg. 9)
- 10. What point does Miss Ralston make when she hits the home run? How does this help explain the conflict in the story? (explain the conflict)
