CONNECTIONS TO ENGLISH: ANSWER in complete sentences.

1. **WRITE IN YOUR JOURNAL:** What is a lifelong dream you have? Explain.
2. Carl and Ellie had a lifelong dream. What was it?
Were they able to have their dream? Explain.
3. **SYMBOLISM: Definitions of symbolism.**
 - o The representation of something in symbolic form or the attribution of symbolic meaning or character to something
 - o A system of symbols or symbolic representation
 - o A symbolic significance or quality i.e. Maple Leaf=Canada; poppy=remembrance
4. In the movie there were a couple of things that showed us the importance of symbolism, for example, the "Ellie Badge".
 - a. What was the, "Ellie Badge?"
 - b. Explain the symbolism connected to this badge. Be sure to explain the "journey" of the badge, because this will help you explain the symbolism.
 - c. Identify and explain another symbol in the movie. **BE CLEAR!**
5. **Relating back to you** 😊 Think of something you own, that has a lot of symbolism in it (it has symbolic meaning; its extremely important to you). It could be something given to you, something you won, and it might be something you have with you right now.
