What Was the "Final Solution"?

The "Final Solution to the Jewish problem was the plan formed by the Nazi's for mass genocide against the Jewish population. The official name for it was "The final solution to the Jewish question".



The Nazi's Goal Before and During WWII?

The Nazi's overall goal was the complete eradication of the "undesirables". They viewed Africans, Homosexuals, Romani Gypsies as well as the Jewish population as these "Undesirables". By getting rid of them the Nazi's believed that their bloodlines would be able to spread and lead the nation to glory.





What Was It Like in a Concentration Camp?

- Living conditions in the camp were extremely poor. They had to follow a strict daily schedule
- They often had to wake up before 5 am so that they would stay weak, they could barely get enough food so that they wouldn't starve to death and then, they were forced outside to work until night fall.
- The prisoners were faced with abuse and humiliation.
- Forced to sleep in broken barracks 6-7 to a bunk often without blankets.
- The weak, the too old and the young people were immediately killed in the gas chambers.

Breanagh) To Me Breanagh Identity means freedom. The freedom to be yourself and love it.

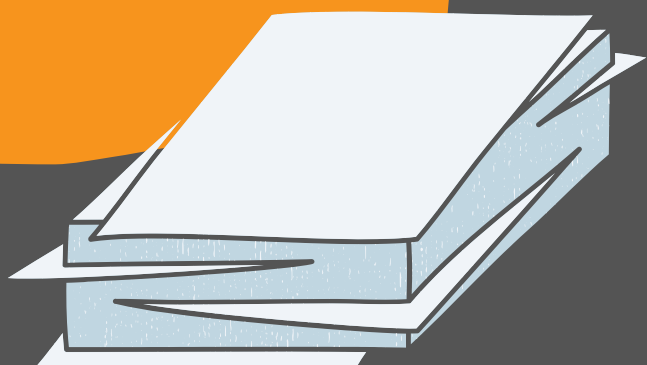
